The event was supported by 17 volunteers giving their time to make a successful event variously looking after the catering as well as coaches to cast for the guests. The hosted school was The Ravensbourne School with 10 children and 4 teachers attending.

On Monday 6th October, 10 students went on the Fishing Trip to
SpringHill Trout Fishery lakes in Pembury in Kent. Each of our
students had 1-1 tuition from an experienced fisherman. They
were taught the skills of casting out and then how to retrieve the
line. It was a beautiful day and most of the fish were resting
towards the bottom of the lake, but we did manage to catch a few
of them! The students spent all morning fishing and then had a
fantastic barbecue lunch before their rewards and certificate
presentation. Jaiden managed to catch a big rainbow trout, which
he took home for dinner! A big thanks to all the staff at Springhill
and a fantastic experience and day was had by all our students.

A convivial lunch was provided which was followed by presentations to every child a framed certificate of achievement and a goody bag.
